Announcements and Reminders

Travel Signatures

Students who are traveling abroad and re-entering the U.S. should request a travel signature in advance.

- Travel signatures are valid for 6 months and are required for re-entry into the US after traveling abroad.
- You also need a valid visa, and your passport must be valid at least 6 months into the future of your return date.
- You must be fully vaccinated to enter the US from abroad. You should travel with your WHO approved vaccination record. These are the <u>WHO approved</u> <u>vaccines</u>.

The process for requesting a Travel Signature depends on if you are an F-1 visa student or a J-1 visa student.

F-1 visa students: You must request an electronic Travel Signature for your I-20 here, <u>Travel Abroad & Travel Signature</u>

J-1 visa students: DS-2019s require a wet signature. You will need to come to inperson advising (see <u>this link</u>) and then plan to stop by VH 201 with your DS-2019 and passport on a day we are holding in-person advising between 11:00 am - 1:00 pm.
