#### International Student Programs and Dual Diploma Office Hours/Advising

The International Student Programs office in VH 201 is open Monday - Friday, 8:30 am - 5:00 pm.

International Student Programs offers in-person and virtual advising. Advising hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 11:00 am - 1:00 pm. Virtual advising is available every Thursday. Please use our <u>Meet with an Advisor</u> link to schedule a virtual appointment. Monday, Tuesday and Friday advising hours are in-person (VH 201).

#### Full-time enrollment requirements

All international students must maintain full-time status.

"Full-time" may differ depending on your program

- ALL Undergraduate degrees, MBA, and MFA: 12 credits
- ALL other graduate degrees: 9 credits
- A combination of ESL and academic courses are OK!
- If you withdraw from a class and doing so drops you below full time at any point you will be in violation of your visa status. Do not do this.
  - An exception is made in your FINAL SEMESTER only

#### Act Now: Confirm your enrollment

Act now! Classes are starting on Monday. It is time to confirm your enrollment. Pay at least 50% of your tuition <u>or</u> accept the time payment plan. Then you will be able to confirm your enrollment. Go to **my.newpaltz.edu and click on the pop-up message to confirm enrollment**. Once your enrollment is confirmed, you will be able to see your Brightspace course site. <u>More information?</u>

If you registered this week, you will need to accept your financial responsibility and pay at least 50% of your bill or accept a time payment plan in order to access the Confirmation of Enrollment within 24 hours.

If you have not yet registered and do not have a student bill, you must complete this process as soon as you are registered and billed by Student Accounts.
